




Academic Advising

- PAL Learning Cohorts for many majors and careers, so students in PAL can support one another's learning goals in their shared paths of study
- PAL Peer Mobile Learning Tutors for additional 1:1 support from fellow students
- PAL Peer Mentoring connects new students with a student in PAL who
 has advanced through the program and "knows the ropes"


